

Harvest of the Month

EASY TACO ROASTED POTATOES

yield: 4 SERVINGS prep time: 10 MINUTES cook time: 30 MINUTES

recipe from cookthisagainmom.com

INGREDIENTS

- 4 Potatoes washed, peeled, and cubed
- 1 Tablespoon Olive Oil
- 1 teaspoon Cumin
- 1 teaspoon Garlic Powder
- 1 teaspoon Chili Powder
- ½ teaspoon Oregano
- 1 teaspoon Smokey Paprika
- ½ teaspoon Salt
- 1/4 teaspoon Pepper

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Pre-heat the oven to 400-degrees.
- 2. Spray baking sheet with non-stick spray.
- 3. Wash, peel, and cube the potatoes into 1-inch cubes.
- 4. Lay the potatoes on the baking sheet and drizzle with the olive oil and seasonings.
- 5. Mix everything together well until all the potatoes are well coated.
- 6. Make sure the potatoes are not crowded on the baking sheet. Space them out as much as possible.
- 7. Bake the potatoes for 25-35 min until fork-tender and golden brown. Turn a time or two during the cooking time.
- 8. Serve the Taco Roasted Potatoes with your favorite taco toppings like salsa, sour cream and shredded cheddar.
